August Beth, Sidney, David, (Paul working), Joey, Esther, Sarah, Priscilla $\rightarrow$ September We attended the Stephen Harvey Family Reunion in Andrews, SC, October and visited family \& friends in CT, PA, NY, and Quebec. Then we 2009 went on a Harvey Girl/SuperDad College Tour to NY, PA, IL, IN, OH, WV, NC, and VA. We attended Samaritan's Purse / World Medical Mission's "Prescription for Renewal" Conference at The Cove (Billy Graham Training Center) in Ashville, NC, on the way. Claire passed her road test and became a NY State licensed driver the day before we left to return to Congo.


Violence erupts in the Equateur Province of Democratic Republic of Congo, 60 miles northeast and across the Oubangui River from Impfondo. What started as tribal clashes,
 quickly transforms into a rebel movement, led by a witchdoctor named Odjani.
$\leftarrow$ Eleven year old Grace got shot in the leg when trying to flee the fighting.
By the end of the year 150,000 more men, women, and children take refuge in the Likouala Region, living in makeshift campsites along the riverbanks. Impfondo's population doubles to 68,055.

November Pioneer Christian Hospital receives two waves December of wounded civilians, caught in the crossfire. As 2009 God would have it, a team from HCJB Global Ecuador is on hand to help $\rightarrow$ Because of the refugee crisis, a number of UN aid agencies and Humanitarian Organizations set up offices in town. It seems like Impfondo is being invaded by white trucks with logos on the doors. As the only hospital equipped to handle surgical emergencies in the region, we develop working relationships with MAG, Doctors Without Borders, MDA, UNHCR, Red Cross,
 ECHO, UNICEF, IPHD, WFP, government ministries, and Embassies. A bunch of high level delegations, including government
 Ministers of Social Affairs, Humanitarian Action, Defense, Security, Health, etc. came to visit our patients.

In the middle of all this activity, the Wegner family arrives for their first term of service as career medical missionaries. Stephen is a Pediatric and Emergency Medicine Room physician. His wife Anna and their 3 young children lan, Isabelle, and Caleb are welcome additions to our team too.
With ongoing violence and rebel activity along the river, we begin to receive a
 number of wounded combatants. Christmas Eve we operate on a record ten patients in one day, all war wounded. At one point, without realizing it, we admit wounded rebels to the same ward where some DRC government soldiers are recovering. Violent score-settling in the hospital is narrowly avoided, thanks to an informant, and God's grace. During our Christmas Service, the Holy Spirit brings about a revival among our patients and their families! Repentance, Reconciliation, Forgiveness, Awareness of God's Protection, and Rejoicing! How thrilling to see people who were trying to kill each other a few weeks before, worshipping and praising God together in the hospital chapel!

At our weekly missionary team meetings, we continue to review emergency procedures just in case things get worse. Talk about a tense time! We are grateful that Anne Stephens from the C\&MA is able to come and lead our team in some debriefing. On New Years' Eve Joe sends Becky and the kids to Brazzaville so they can take a break (from his stress), and he can relax with a few less dependents on the list, in case of evacuation.

January By the time things calm down, our records indicate that we have treated 55 people with gunshot wounds, 10 with February machete wounds, and none of them died! Even with God's obvious blessing and protection, we are overwhelmed by March 2010 the rapid turnover of hospital and missionary staff, the constant flow of visitors, and a lot of other very sick patients (most get better miraculously, but some die, despite our best efforts). We are unable to keep up. Joe and Rachel Maurais (our outgoing hospital administrator) prepare annual meetings with the hospital employees. We are able to raise the pay scale for the second time in 4 years © . Joe travels to Kenya for the Christian Medical \& Dental

Associations' Continuing Medical Education Conference. Joe's last uncle, Walter Barth dies, and we miss another family funeral $: *$. The Phillips Family who served as hosts at GOM's Bravo Ministry Center and Guest House in Brazzaville, leave for an indefinite furlough. Olivia \& Claire visit friends at Rain Forest International School in Cameroon.
April The Marsh family arrives after 8 years of deputation! For the first time in the May history of Pioneer Christian Hospital, we have 3 doctors, a pharmacist, an June administrator, a chaplain, a physician's assistant, a qualified lab technician, a 2010 mechanic, skilled interpreters, a construction supervisor, and 5 missionary nurses, all at the same time. This enables us to make great strides forward in patient care and organization. Unfortunately, our time with a complete
 team ends way too soon, as vacations, support
 shortfalls, higher education, and furloughs pull people in different directions, and short-termers return home.

After 5+ years since November Dad Jones' death, we have the blessed assurance that December Delbert \& Waneta Jones are together again! $\rightarrow$ 2010 We can't make it to the funeral in time, but are comforted in our grief and thankful to be drawn closer to family just the same. GOM's Pioneer Christian Hospital Executive Committee holds its $4^{\text {th }}$ Annual Meeting in Brazzaville. Joe is re-elected medical director for another term. Our team pulls
 together to make final preparations to begin a nurses' training program. We are honored to serve as the groom's witnesses for our friends' wedding in Pointe Noire, which turned out to be a celebration of biblical proportions! We enjoy yet another Happy Thanksgiving, $\downarrow$ Merry Christmas \& Harvey New Year in Impfondo.
